Elementary Spanish

Michigan students, like students throughout the United States, are living in and contributing to an increasingly diverse society and interdependent community of nations in the 21st century. To realize their personal, social, and long-term career goals, individuals need to be able to communicate with others skillfully, appropriately, and effectively. The challenge of contemporary education is to prepare all students for life in this new world.

Because language and communication are at the heart of the human experience, the United States must equip students linguistically and culturally to communicate successfully in a pluralistic American society and abroad. This imperative envisions a future in which all students develop and maintain proficiency in English and in at least one other language. Over an 11-week course, we will discuss missionaries that live in various Spanish-speaking countries, learn praise songs in Spanish, and also study basic vocabulary and topics.

Elementary German

Elementary German focuses on teaching vocabulary through various activities such as writing, labeling, memorization, interactive games, role-play, and music. German speaking countries in Europe and their specific geography, history, culture, and people are introduced. Similarities, differences, and German influences found in the United States create cultural awareness and an increasing understanding and appreciation for diversity on the foundation of the Bible.
