P – Purity, where we talk about how purity should be pursued— not just living to avoid impurity, but really striving to be pure in body, soul and mind. L – Love, where we expand more practically what it means to practice the two greatest commandments: to love the Lord with all your heart, soul, mind and strength; and to love your neighbor as yourself. E - Eternal Perspective, always living in view of eternity, realizing our time here on earth is so short compared to eternity. The choices we make, the things that cause us to be anxious, etc., must be put into perspective – God's perspective.
